Five Ways to Serve Central NC FCA When You Adopt-A-Huddle

I. Start Up

- Help identify Christian coaches / teachers who can sponsor and lead the huddle.
- Help identify Christian student athletes for the student leadership team.
- Make sure your huddle is registered and able to receive FCA resources.
- Raise the money for the yearly budget. Examples: HS = \$2000 @ 17 people giving \$10/month.

II. Organization

- Help the huddle secure a place and time to meet on campus.
- Make sure the meetings are well-publicized and well-planned.
- Visit the meetings. Are prayer and the word shared each time?
- Are the meetings marked by enthusiasm and passion?
- Are the meetings athletically focused?

III. Growth

- Be a servant. Ask the leaders and huddle coach what you can do.
- At the request of the leaders, recruit strong guest speakers.
- Provide food or refreshments for FCA meetings and events.
- Help plan special events like breakfast meetings, evening rallies, or school assemblies.
- Develop a special ministry to coaches and their wives.
- Make sure there a plan to share Christ with non-Christian students.
- Help start a team chapel program.

IV. Prayer

- Pray for leaders, coaches, teachers, staff and administrators by name by using the yearbook as a guide.

V. Teamwork

- Find out about local, state, regional, and national FCA events and help promote and recruit your kids and coaches to attend.
- Inform your FCA Staff person of positive results, any needs, concerns or problems

Your FCA Staff Person's Job

- Huddle maintenance - He makes sure the huddle is running smoothly and effectively.
- Training - He trains student leaders and coaches in huddle leadership.
- Special events - He plans and directs camps, retreats, rallies, and school assemblies.
- Speaking - He speaks at many huddle meetings, team chapels, and school assemblies.
- Influence - He spends time with all coaches and administrators on campus.
- Team Chapels - He plans and promotes the Team Chapel concept.
- Resources - He equips the leaders with huddle resources and a speakers' list.
- Adult Chapters - He works to promote parental involvement.
